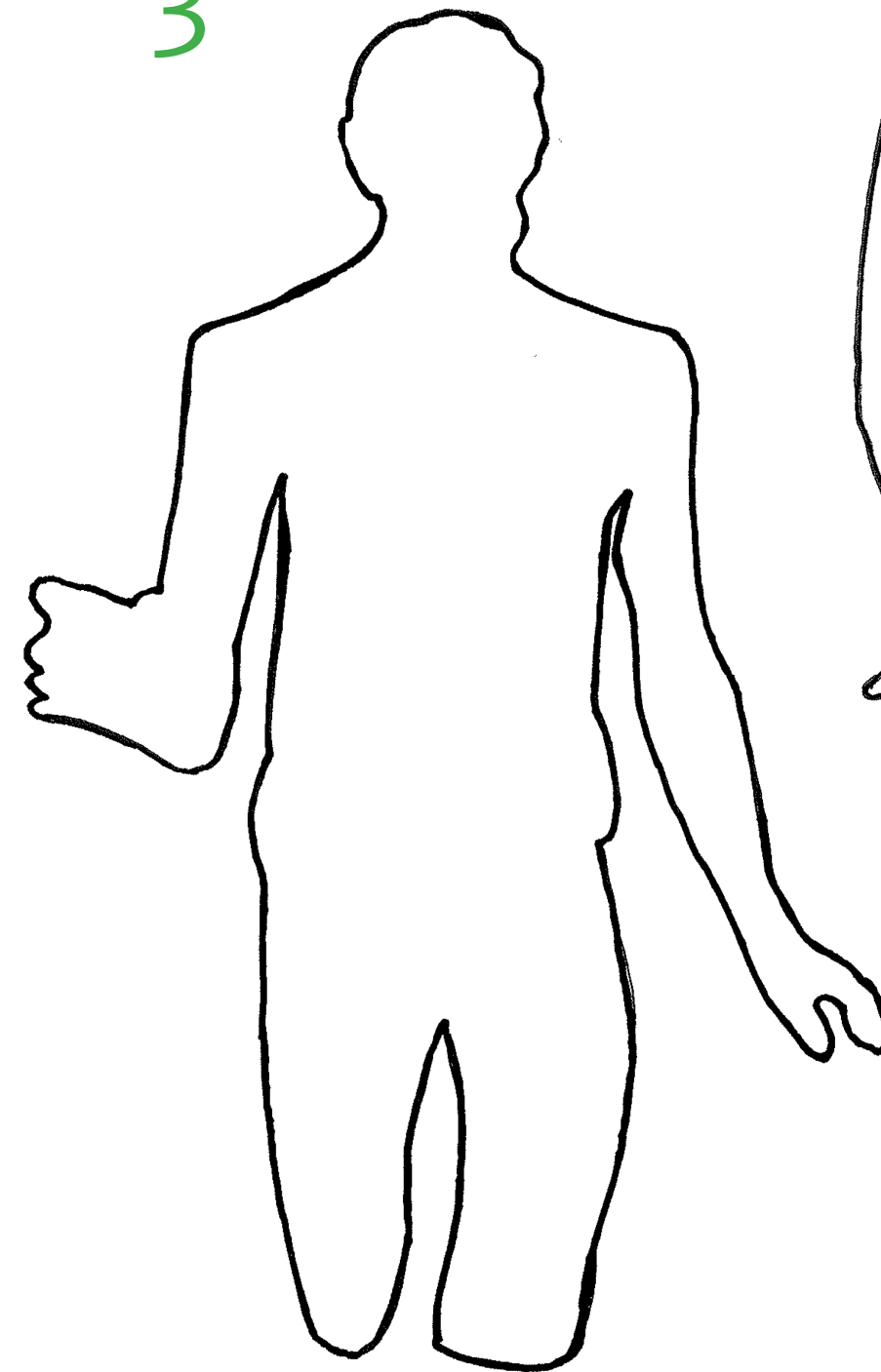

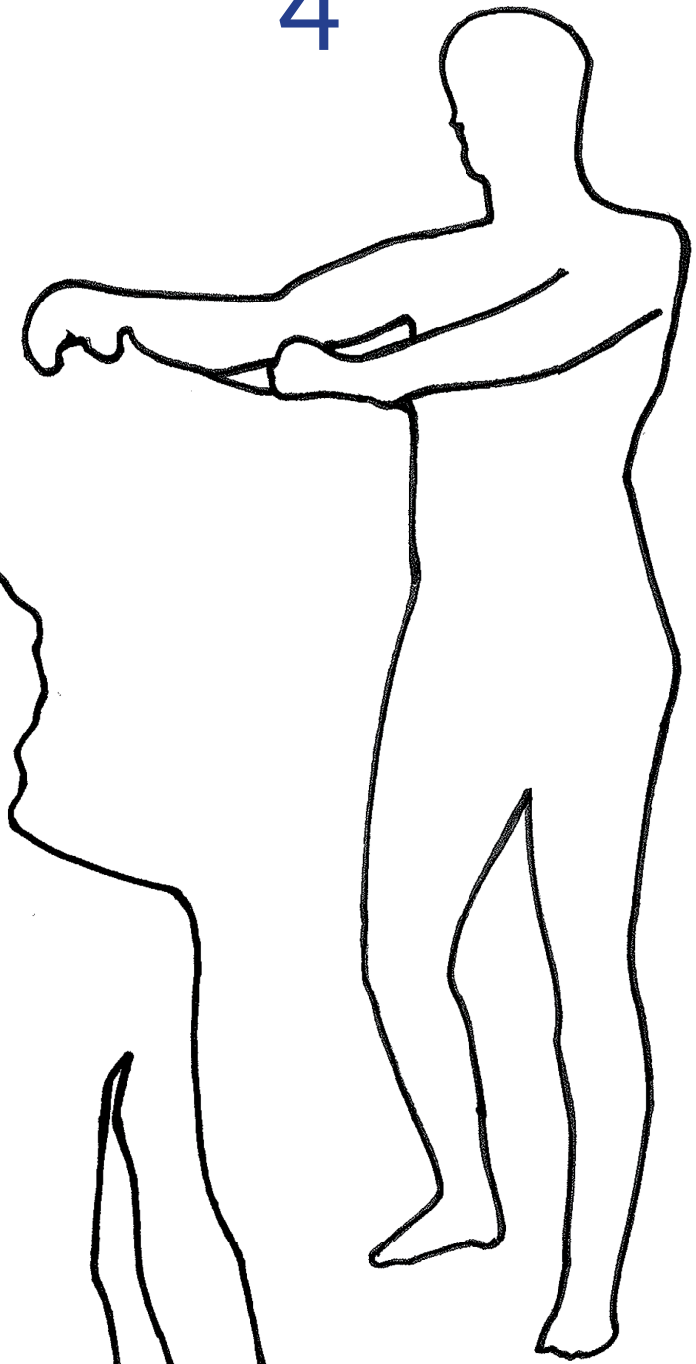

What's in the Cast Gallery?

The cast gallery is home to many copies of statues from Ancient Greece and Rome, made out of plaster. The Ancient Greeks and Romans made statues of their gods or rulers as well as ordinary people.

Find this detail from a big cast.

A shaggy dog is biting the head of a giant. The dog belongs to the hunting goddess Artemis who is angry with the giant.

- Who do you think will win, the dog or the giant?

- Find the goddess Artemis' leg and foot.

The giant has a man's body (torso) but the legs of a serpent or snake.

- Look for the giant's serpent scales.
